Read 1 Samuel 16:1-13.

Read 1 Samuel 16:1,2. Samuel is in hiding, afraid to go when God calls him. What fears do you need to bring out into the light about listening to God's call for your life?

Read 1 Samuel 16:6-10. Jesse and Samuel make some judgements about who God will choose to use. What judgements do I make about who God uses? Am I writing someone off prematurely?

Discipleship is a personal relationship in which we help one another to become transformed into the image of Jesus. Read *Mark 1:17,18*; *Matthew 28:18-20* and *Acts 1:8*. How do these verses inform me in my concept of what discipleship is- or is not? What are they saying to me about what I need to be doing in my discipleship journey with Jesus?

Discipleship is all about starting where I am in my journey with God and then moving forward. Where would I say I am today on my journey? What is my next step?
