
Sunday - December 2, 2024 - Second Sunday of Advent



"Let's just get through the holidays." Sound familiar? For many this season is one of celebrations with family in friends. For some it is a harsh reminder of broken families and relationships that have festered all year. For others, a simple call for a "cease fire" between them.

KEY VERSE: "He himself is our peace, who has made the two one and has destroyed the dividing wall of hostility by abolishing in his flesh, the law and its commandments and regulations." (Ephesians 2:15)

Last week our theme was, "Peace with myself." When I step into the identity God has given to me, I find peace. This week we look at the peace that God can provide in my personal relationships- especially among those in which I have built walls between us.

The Ephesian church is one that is in conflict. Jewish believers thinking Jesus only was for them. Gentile believers who were treated as outsiders and resented it. Paul writes to ensure them that God has called them to be one.
